Health Update

MMVD Research in Cavalier King Charles Spaniels

“Over the past 7 years, Niek Beijerink and I have worked together to explore the genomics of CKCS MMVD. Niek and I supervised Dr Mitchell O’Brien for his PhD on CKCS MMVD. Mitchell has recently graduated and left us, but he had some important findings that might impact MMVD progression to heart failure. These are yet to be published.

As you are aware, Norway has recently moved to ban the breeding of CKCS based on a perception that the breed is fixed for MMVD risk genes. It is likely that this opinion was formed by a recent scientific publication:

Axelsson E, Ljungvall I, Bhoumik P, ConnLB, Muren E, Ohlsson Å, et al. (2021) The genetic consequences of dog breed formation—Accumulation of deleterious genetic variation and fixation of mutations associated with myxomatous mitral valve disease in cavalier King Charles spaniels. *PLoS Genet* 17(9): e1009726. <https://doi.org/10.1371/journal.pgen.1009726>

This publication reported that CKCS are invariant/fixed for negative variants in genes that were shown to have a functional relationship with heart health. The research group identified four highly conserved variants in protein coding genes that may relate to MMVD and six variants near the Nebulette (NEBL) gene that they believed might affect the operation of the gene. Their conclusion of breed fixation was based on whole genome sequencing of 20 CKCS.

In particular, the group were concerned about fixation for the NEBL gene. Because the NEBL gene did not vary in the CKCS in their study, they tested whether the variants identified affected cardiac function in a second breed (Dachshund). They were able to show that the risk variant (fixed in CKCS) was positively connected with MMVD in the Dachshund, and they were able to show that the operation of the gene was influenced by the variants that they identified (using a laboratory study).

In 2022, honours student Sophie Mead was interested to work with CKCS. We asked Sophie to test the Australian CKCS to see if they were also fixed for the genes identified by the Axelsson paper. Sophie found that the Australian population varies for most of the genes of concern, but the NEBL gene seemed like it was less variable than the others. However, we did identify a handful of individuals that appeared to carry the rarer, normal NEBL variants based on our own genetic screening. These dogs come from ANKC breeders from at least three kennels in Australia. Our own statistical analysis shows that the individuals carrying the positive variant are significantly less at risk of cardiac risk measurements than the dogs without the normal variants. This tells us that the rarer normal variants are very much worth protecting.



We are hoping to urge Australian Cavalier King Charles Spaniel breeders to protect the variation that remains in the NEBL gene. A targeted breeding program could rapidly increase the frequency of the positive variant and perhaps significantly reduce the overall breed risk for MMVD. This provides a way of combating fixation at this gene without needing to crossbreed. We are currently seeking advice from Animal Ethics as to the best way to allow the important information to be disseminated since losing the genes is a real possibility.

A second gene that was also predicted to be fixed in the Axelsson paper also has a handful of dogs with the normal variant in the Australian population, but our statistical analysis did not show improved cardiac measurements for these dogs so at this time we recommend focusing on the NEBL gene.

To move forward, one thing that might be possible is for CKCS breeders to use Embark DNA testing. Uniquely among test providers, Embark allows dog owners to download the raw data for their tested dog. If this was shared with our group, we can then report back to the owner, the NEBL testing status of the dog. Another option is to have a targeted single test made available via a local laboratory. This would be cheaper than the panel test– but would not

How many animals are you testing? Discount or society code:

The code gives our members \$6 off the list price which is \$54 per dog. This is the same as the discount for doing a large number of animals but applies even if they are just testing a single dog. (Discounts aren't cumulative so members doing more than five dogs at once will still get the same price.)

Any queries about the Application for testing are to be directed to www.breeding.dog. All interactions are solely between the Applicant and the Testing lab.

"... this test is based on the work that Claire has been doing and the work the Axelsson team did in Europe that was published in 2021. We've picked one of the three markers that Claire describes in her paper, based on the advice of her and her student. I think there is still a decent chance that this test will need to evolve as more is discovered about the gene or genes involved, but I've found that some breeders are so eager to make progress on this issue that they want to be able to use this test though it might still be a work in progress. (v) Jeanie Montford stated that it takes nine months to get approval for overseas Judges, and so advised the Show Secretary that time was of the essence. She therefore requested that nominations should be received from Members by the Show Secretary within one week, and that an email should be sent to all Members immediately.

(vi) The wording of the nomination for two potential Judges in Club documents was also questioned by the ex-President, who felt some may believe they could only nominate two names, instead of the original intention of two judges for two shows, with multiple nominations acceptable from any Member.

11 General Business:

- (i) The Secretary reported that she had received no physical records from the Club, and the ex-President and ex-Secretary advised her that all hard copies were in the storage unit on the Dogs NSW Show Ground site. It was agreed that they would be handed to her at the end of the Meeting.
- (ii) Marilyn Madigan advised that a Membership Application had not been included in this Meeting. The President advised that he would have it to hand for the next Meeting.
- (iii) John Christie advised the Meeting that the Year Book 2023 was being promoted on the internet and in the Club Newsletter. He does need the information regarding the Royal Show and State Specialty winners. In the past this has been provided by Karen Paul, who has been contacted with a view to helping us this year. Apparently, this information is available from Dogs NSW for a fee of \$50.00.
- (iv) The Membership application process was again addressed, and again caused much discussion. The President suggested that applications should be submitted to the Committee, who would review them prior to presentation to a General Meeting. Any Member at the Meeting objecting an application would then have seven days to submit an objection (detailing why they believe the person is not acceptable for Membership) within seven days. The President stated that Dogs NSW, the ANKC, and most other Clubs simply accept Members on good faith. Jane Schmarr asked why Membership applications were required to be voted on since both Proposer and Secunder must be financial Members of the Club, and surely they would only support applications from those they believed were worthy of Membership, whereas refusal of an application could be taken negatively against those who proposed the declined application. Kim Perkiss stated that it was her belief that the more Members that we attracted, the more we could do in many ways. It was agreed that a Special General Meeting should be convened to address this issue.



- (iv) The date of the Annual General Meeting was raised. The fact that it currently is held just a few weeks before the September Championship Shows is questionable. When an entire Committee may be changed at the AGM it makes plain common sense for those who have planned and organized the end of year Shows to follow through and run them, with an AGM in October to welcome in any or all of the new Committee.
- (v) The President raised the issue that our 2006 Constitution is significantly out of date and should be reviewed by our Members at a General Special Meeting.

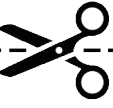

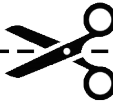

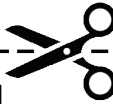
