## Flashback: July/August 1995 Newsletter

CLUB EVENTS

#### Fun Day

In the midst of all that rain the Sunday before Mother's Day we held our Fun and Education Day. It was well publicised in the Sydney papers and attracted a great amount of interest (judging by the endless phone calls I received). We had a good roll up considering the weather and I am sure that we would have had even more people attend had it not been raining. As it was I think the only place in Sydney not experiencing torrential rain on the day was Castle Hill and we had sunshine for just about all of the day (although just before lunch it came over very black and we had a light shower). I know that the pet owners who attended had a good time and so did the club members.

To start the day we had a handling demonstration by Rosemary Duffy, an experienced Obedience Instructor who has two Cavaliers. She also gave a hands on lesson on lead training and walking which was very well patronised. Next we had a grooming demonstration by Jeanie Montford who is a professional groomer and this was so popular that the half hour event went on all day! Jeanie was beseiged by people wanting toe nails cut on dogs they can't hold to trim their nails (although Jeanie had no problems!) and knots removed and one even had its feet trimmed. I know the owners appreciated this help tremendously.

Our next event was an Obedience Demonstration by Beryl Hammond assisted by her friend Audrey. They came all the way from the Central Coast for the day. A lot of us had never seen a Cavalier doing obedience work and Beryl and Legolas Chester CDX UD were very impressive. They certainly received a loud round of applause when they finished although there were a few anxious moments while we waited for Chester to find the metal baton with Beryl's seent on it. I think he may have been playing with us as I am sure I saw a smile on his face when he looked up at the crowd just before he found the right one.

We then had lunch, a sausage sizzle cooked to perfection by Phil Stanley who must be thanked for his help in setting up and giving up his day while Elaine was at home whelping puppies. Catering and the stall items raised \$250.00. After lunch we held the fun events which were a good giggle. Paul Cootes organised the events which ranged from largest Cavalier (won by his own "pet" blenheim), smallest Cavalier (adult dogs only) and judge Marilyn Madigan had a tough decision between two exhibits calling for an adjudication. The Hungriest Dog contest was fiercely competed (amongst the owners!) with the two finalists being from Merseyport stock (the dogs not the owners!) and the winner was Jan McCormick's Cavalking Misty Moon.

The last event for the day was Musical Plates where paper plates are placed on the ground and the dogs/owners have to walk around until the music stops (or in our case when Paul called stop) and then the dog must sit on the plate. Like musical chairs this goes on until only one plate and two dogs/owners remain. If you thought the hungriest dog competition was hard fought it left nothing on this one with Jan McCormick and Rosemary Duffy doing battle and Jan ultimately the winner amidst a lot of laughter.

We had a lot of enquiries from those in attendance asking when we will be holding our next Fun and Education Day so I think this one was a big success. Thanks to all those who helped out and who attended and hopefully the next one will be a bit dryer.

#### Visit to Menai High School

In February we received a letter from a teacher at Menai High School regarding a course the school was running for Year 8 students called Pet Vet. She wrote to all of the Breed Clubs asking if they would like to come to the school and give a talk on their breed to the children. She had a big response from the various clubs and we had to wait until 18 May for a free date! (she only has the classes




twice a week). I was happy to go along and asked Karen Paul if she would come with me and bring some dogs as well as a Charlie to show the kids the difference between the two breeds. We arrived in the rain (it seems to be the way at the moment) and were greeted by one of the school secretaries who was very pleased to see us as she has a Cavalier from Rhonda Callaghan and was very interested to see all the dogs. Her son was also in one of the classes and was looking forward to the day. Karen's mum, May Fox, also came along and helped out with the dogs.

We had one dog of each colour and a Black and Tan Charlie and of course as soon as the kids saw them they wanted to nurse them. The dogs were wonderful and on their best behaviour although Tiger was a bit keen on Melissa and needed to be separated at one stage!

We had two lectures to give and we took along some prints, books and statues and the kids seemed to enjoy it all. I must say though there were one or two looking down at their bottle green jumpers and brushing a lot of hairs off afterwards! The school gave us a certificate of appreciation which was very nice and made the hour drive home all the more worthwhile.
